




Android SDK Platform-Tools is a component for the Android app developers will normally just use the copy Studio installs. This download is useful if you want to use adb directly from the command-line and don't have Studio installed. (If you do have Studio installed, you might want to just use the copy it installed because Studio Profiler, gpuinspector.dev, or Perfetto. Although some new features in adb and fastboot are available only for recent versions of Android, they're backward compatible, so you should only need the latest SDK Platform-Tools and should file bugs if you find exceptions.
